## FINAL ORDER

On October 9, 2019, the Supreme Court of California issued an order disbarring Mogeeb Weiss from the practice of law in California. *See Weiss on Discipline*, Docket No. S256765 (Oct. 9, 2019).

Mr. Weiss has been a member of this Court's bar since July 9, 2014 and has no pending cases. Under Rule 83.2(c)(2) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC"), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined for an act or omission that results in the attorney's disbarment or suspension by another court. Reciprocal disbarment is the presumed discipline for an attorney's disbarment by another court. RCFC 83.2(g)(7)(B). Mr. Weiss also failed to notify this Court of his disbarment, which is a violation of RCFC 83.2(e)(1)(B) and additional grounds for discipline under RCFC 83.2(c)(4).

On March 5, 2020, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Weiss to show cause within thirty (30) days why he should not be disbarred from practice before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Weiss would be permanently disbarred from practice before the Court. *Id.* To date, Mr. Weiss has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Mogeeb Weiss shall be permanently disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims effective, *nunc pro tunc*, November 8, 2019, the date of his disbarment in California. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
