ORDER

On March 20, 2020, the Supreme Court of California ordered that attorney Cruz Saavedra be suspended from the practice of law in California for one (1) year, with ten (10) months stayed in favor of probation. *See In re Cruz Saavedra on Discipline*, Docket No. S260168 (Mar. 20, 2020). On May 1, 2020, the U.S. Court of Federal Claims reciprocally suspended Mr. Saavedra from the practice of law before the Court for sixty (60) days, effective, *nunc pro tunc*, April 19, 2020, the date of his suspension in California.

On June 18, 2020, Mr. Saavedra was reinstated as an active member of the California State Bar. On July 8, 2020 Mr. Saavedra submitted a Petition for Reinstatement to this Court that meets the requirements of RCFC 83.2(k) and demonstrates that he is fit to resume the practice of law. Based on the foregoing and for good cause shown, we conclude that it is in the interest of justice to grant the Petition and reinstate Mr. Saavedra. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Cruz Saavedra is reinstated to the practice of law before this Court in accordance with Rule 83.2(k)(3)(B). Reinstatement is effective on the date of entry of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of Court shall serve Mr. Saavedra with a copy of this Order.
