## In the United States Court of Federal Claims

## FINAL ORDER

On October 23, 2020, the Virginia State Bar Disciplinary Board revoked Jonathan Christian Dailey's license to practice law. *See In the Matter of Jonathan Christian Dailey*, VSB Docket No. 20-000-118485 (Va. 2020). Mr. Dailey did not report to this Court this revocation as required by Rule 83.2(e) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC"). The Court learned of Mr. Dailey's revocation on October 26, 2020. Mr. Dailey is currently suspended from practice before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 2.

Mr. Dailey has been a member of this Court's bar since July 7, 1999 and has no pending cases. Under Rule 83.2(c)(2), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of an act or omission that results in the disbarment or suspension of the attorney by another court. In addition, under Rule 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of failure to comply with the terms of Rule 83.2, including failure to notify the Court in accordance with Rule 83.2(e).

On October 28, 2020, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Dailey to show cause within 30 days why he should not be disbarred from practice before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 5. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Dailey would be permanently disbarred from practice. Id. To date, Mr. Dailey has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Jonathan Christian Dailey shall be disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims, effective, *nunc pro tunc*, October 26, 2020, the date this Court received notice of the revocation of his license to practice law in Virginia. See RCFC 83.2(h)(2). The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
