NOTICE

It has come to the attention of the U.S. Court of Federal Claims (Court) that phishing letters, using the Court's name and seal, are being sent to various persons for the purpose of collecting personal information. The letters refer to an "inheritance claims process" and solicit the recipient to send personal information, including name, address, phone number, and a "scanned copy" of a driver's license or passport, for the purpose of completing "the legal process of claims."

The above-described phishing letters are scams. The Court does not solicit personal information by letter, email, or other types of correspondence. If you are the recipient of such a letter, please do not respond to the letter or otherwise provide the personal information solicited.

We have reported the scheme to the U.S. Marshals Service, Department of Justice.
