FINAL ORDER

On December 20, 2021, the Supreme Court of California entered an order suspending Grenville Thomas Pridham from the practice of law for a period of 60 days. *In re Grenville Thomas Pridham on Discipline*, State Bar Court Case No. 17-O-04373 (Ca. 2021). Mr. Pridham did not notify this Court of his suspension as is required by Rule 83.2(e)(1)(B) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC"). The Court learned of Mr. Pridham's suspension on July 29, 2022.

Mr. Pridham has been a member of this Court's bar since November 22, 2004, and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(2), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined for an act or omission that results in the attorney's disbarment or suspension by another court. In addition, under RCFC 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of failure to comply with the terms of RCFC 83.2, including failure to notify the Court in accordance with RCFC 83.2(e).

On August 16, 2022, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Pridham to show cause within 30 days why he should not be reciprocally suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 4. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Pridham would be suspended from practice before this Court for a period of 60 days. *Id.* To date, Mr. Pridham has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Grenville Thomas Pridham is suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims for a period of 60 days effective, *nunc pro tunc*, July 29, 2022, the date this Court received notice of his suspension in California. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
