**DECISION ON ATTORNEY'S FEES AND ATTORNEY'S COSTS<sup>1</sup>**

Petitioner, Reverend John M. Young (Reverend Young), seeks an award of attorney's fees and attorney's costs for an action that he pursued successfully under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program (Program).<sup>2</sup> Because Reverend Young received Program compensation, the Act mandates the award of "reasonable attorneys' fees" and "other costs." § 300aa-15(e)(1). The parties stipulate as a matter of fact now that the sum of \$74,435.83 represents a reasonable award for attorney's fees and attorney's costs in this case. See Stipulation of Fact Concerning Attorney's Fees and Costs (Stipulation of Fact), filed December 4, 2007, ¶ 3.<sup>3</sup> In addition, the parties stipulate as a matter of fact now that Reverend Young did not incur any personal expenses as defined by General Order No. 9. See Stipulation of Fact, ¶ 4.

<sup>1</sup> As provided by Vaccine Rule 18(b), each party has 14 days within which to request redaction "of any information furnished by that party (1) that is trade secret or commercial or financial information and is privileged or confidential, or (2) that are medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy." Vaccine Rule 18(b). Otherwise, "the entire decision" will be available to the public. *Id.*

The special master has considered carefully the parties' Stipulation of Fact. Based upon his experience, the special master determines that the Stipulation of Fact is appropriate. Therefore, in the absence of a motion for review filed under RCFC Appendix B, the clerk of court shall enter judgment in Reverend Young's favor for \$74,435.83 in attorney's fees and attorney's costs. The judgment shall provide that Reverend Young's attorney of record, Paul S. Dannenberg, Esq. (Mr. Dannenberg), may collect \$74,435.83 from Reverend Young. Under Vaccine Rule 11(a), the parties may expedite entry of judgment by filing a joint notice renouncing the right to seek review.

The clerk of court shall send Reverend Young's copy of this decision to Reverend Young by overnight express delivery.
