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DECISION¹

On August 13, 2007, the respondent filed a Motion to Dismiss on the basis of petitioner's claim that a pneumococcal conjugate vaccine caused her injury. As petitioner notes, the pneumococcal vaccine is not a covered vaccine under the Program. During a status conference conducted on September 12, 2007, petitioner agreed that petitioner received the Pneumovax vaccine and agreed that the Pneumovax is not covered under the Program. Petitioner agreed with respondent that this case should be dismissed.

Accordingly, the undersigned dismisses this petition for want of jurisdiction. The Clerk shall enter judgment accordingly.
