## **DECISION<sup>1</sup> (ATTORNEY FEES AND COSTS)**

In this case under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program, I issued a Decision on October 7, 2011, dismissing this case. On October 28, 2011, petitioners filed a Motion for attorneys' fees and costs in this matter. That Motion requests a total payment of \$6,766.01, representing attorneys' fees of \$6,600.00, and costs of \$166.01. Respondent's counsel, Linda Renzi, contacted a member of my staff by e-mail on November 7, 2011, to confirm that respondent does not object to such an award. In lieu of filing a Vaccine General Order 9 statement, petitioners' counsel agrees to reimburse petitioners any costs that petitioners personally incurred that are compensable under § 15(e)(1).

I find that this petition was brought in good faith and that there existed a reasonable basis for the claim. Therefore, an award for fees and costs is appropriate, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(b) and (e)(1). Further, the proposed amount seems reasonable and appropriate. Accordingly, I hereby award the total of \$6,766.01 as a lump sum, in the form of a check payable jointly to petitioners, and petitioners' counsel, John N. Hamilton.
