DECISION¹ (ATTORNEY FEES AND COSTS)

In this case under the National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program,² I issued a decision on June 24, 2011, dismissing this case. On September 28, 2011, petitioner filed a Motion concerning attorney’s fees and costs in this matter. The Motion requests a total payment of \$11,386.72, representing \$4,085.00 for attorney’s fees, \$7086.73 for attorney’s costs, and \$215.00 for costs incurred by petitioner in pursuit of her claim. Petitioner represents that respondent does not oppose the amounts requested.

I find that this petition was brought in good faith and that there existed a reasonable basis for the claim. Therefore, an award for fees and costs is appropriate, pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(b) and (e)(1). Further, the proposed amounts seem reasonable and appropriate. Accordingly, I hereby award:

Otherwise, “the entire” decision will be available to the public. Id.

- A lump sum of \$11,171.73, (\$4,085.00 for attorney’s fees, and \$7086.73 for costs) in the form of a check payable jointly to petitioner and petitioner’s attorney, Richard Gage.
- A lump sum of \$215.00, in the form of a check payable to petitioner.

In the absence of a timely-filed motion for review filed pursuant to Appendix B of the Rules of the U.S. Court of Federal Claims, the clerk of the court shall enter judgment in accordance herewith.
