DECISION AWARDING ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS¹

On December 20, 2011, the parties communicated that they reached an amount to which respondent does not object.

In accordance with the General Order #9 requirements, petitioner states she incurred \$127.15 in costs to pursue her petition.

L. No. 107-347, 116 Stat. 2899, 2913 (Dec. 17, 2002). Vaccine Rule 18(b) states that all decisions of the special masters will be made available to the public unless they contain trade secrets or commercial or financial information that is privileged and confidential, or medical or similar information whose disclosure would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy. When such a decision is filed, petitioner has 14 days to identify and move to redact such information prior to the document's disclosure. If the special master, upon review, agrees that the identified material fits within the banned categories listed above, the special master shall redact such material from public access.

Respondent has indicated that she will not object to \$94,500.00 in fees and costs for Shoemaker & Associates and \$127.15 for petitioner's costs. The undersigned finds these amounts to be reasonable. The court awards **\$94,500.00**, representing reimbursement for attorneys' fees and costs. The award shall be in the form of one check made jointly payable to petitioner and Shoemaker & Associates in the amount of **\$94,500.00**. Additionally, the court awards **\$127.15**, representing reimbursement for petitioner's costs. The award shall be in the form of a check made payable solely to petitioner in the amount of **\$127.15**.

In the absence of a motion for review filed pursuant to RCFC Appendix B, the clerk of the court is directed to enter judgment herewith.²
