UNPUBLISHED DECISION ON FEES AND COSTS¹

Respondent filed a stipulation of fact concerning final attorneys' fees and costs in the above-captioned matter on June 28, 2013. Petitioner informally submitted an application for attorneys' fees and costs ("Application") to respondent, requesting \$19,590.00 for attorneys' fees and \$772.03 for costs incurred by petitioner's counsel. In compliance with General Order #9, petitioner states that she incurred no costs in pursuing her petition. Respondent does not object to the total amount requested by petitioner—\$20,362.03. The Court awards this amount.

Petitioner filed her petition on September 20, 2012 and was awarded compensation on May 2, 2013. Judgment entered on May 21, 2013. Because petitioners received compensation, they are entitled to an award of attorneys' fees and costs. 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(e).

Petitioner seeks a total of **\$20,362.03** in attorneys' fees and costs for her counsel. Respondent has no objection to the amount requested for attorneys' fees and costs.

¹ The E-Government Act of 2002, Pub. L. No. 107-347, 116 Stat. 2899, 2913 (Dec. 17, 2002), requires that the Court post this decision on its website. Pursuant to Vaccine Rule 18(b), the parties have 14 days to file a motion proposing redaction of medical information or other information described in 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-12(d)(4). After reviewing the request, the Court awards a check made payable to petitioner and petitioner's attorney, Gil L. Daley, II, in the amount of **\$20,362.03** for attorneys' fees and other litigation costs. The Court thanks the parties for their cooperative efforts in resolving this matter.

The Clerk shall enter judgment accordingly.²
