- 4. A lump sum payment of \$6,088.83, representing compensation for satisfaction of the Health Plan of Nevada Medicaid lien, payable jointly to petitioners and**

- 5. An amount sufficient to purchase an annuity contract, subject to the conditions described below, that will provide payments for the life care items contained in the life care plan, as illustrated by the chart at Tab A attached hereto, paid to the life insurance company⁴ from which the annuity will be purchased. Compensation for Year Two (beginning on the first anniversary of the date of judgment) and all subsequent years shall be provided through respondent's purchase of an annuity, which annuity shall make payments directly to petitioners as guardians/conservators of the estate of N.S., for the benefit of N.S., only so long as N.S. is alive at the time a particular payment is due. At the Secretary's sole discretion, the periodic payments may be provided to petitioners in monthly, quarterly, annual or other installments. The "annual amounts" set forth in the chart at Tab A describe only the total yearly sum to be paid to petitioners and do not require that the payment be made in one annual installment.**

The Clerk's Office is instructed to enter judgment in accord with this decision unless a motion for review is filed.² The Clerk's Office is also instructed to provide a copy of this decision to the presiding judge, pursuant to Vaccine Rule 28.1(a).

² Pursuant to Vaccine Rule 11(a), the parties can expedite entry of judgment by each party filing a notice renouncing the right to seek review by a United States Court of Federal Claims judge.
