**DECISION AWARDING ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS<sup>1</sup>**

On March 28, 2008 petitioner filed an application for attorneys' fees and costs. Petitioner requests **\$29,057.26** in fees and costs. Respondent has no objections to this request. In compliance with General Order #9, petitioner states that she has incurred no costs.

The clerk shall enter judgment for **\$29,057.26** and shall direct that the award be in the form a check made jointly payable to petitioner and Mr. Ronald C. Homer in the amount of **\$22,222.87**, and one check made jointly payable to petitioner and Mr. Michael R. Richmond in the amount of **\$6,834.39**.

In the absence of a motion for review filed pursuant to RCFC Appendix B, the clerk of the court is directed to enter judgment herewith.

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<sup>1</sup> The Court encourages the parties to review Vaccine Rule 18, which affords each party 14 days to object to disclosure of (1) trade secrets or commercial or financial information that is privileged or confidential, or (2) medical information that would constitute "a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy."
