DECISION AWARDING ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS^1

On March 10, 2008, petitioners filed an application for attorneys' fees and costs.
Petitioners request \$19,100.00 in fees and costs. Respondent has no objection to this request. In
compliance with General Order #9, petitioners state that they have not incurred any expenses.
The court finds the amount requested by petitioners to be reasonable.

The clerk shall enter judgment for \$19,100.00 and shall direct that the award be in the
form of two checks: a check made payable to petitioners James P. Musarra, Jr. and Patricia
Musarra as parents and natural guardians of Franklin Musarra in the amount of \$2,000.00; and a
check made jointly payable to petitioners and the Maglio Christopher & Toale Law Firm in the

amount of \$17,100.00.
