UNPUBLISHED DECISION<sup>1</sup>

On February 4, 2010, the parties filed a joint stipulation concerning the petition for compensation filed by Annie Jackson on April 2, 2007. In her petition, Ms. Jackson alleged that the trivalent influenza (“flu”) vaccine, which is contained in the Vaccine Injury Table, 42 C.F.R. §100.3 (a), and which she received on October 26, 2006, caused her to sustain “severe and debilitating headaches and other physical ailments.”

Respondent denies that Ms. Jackson’s condition was caused by her flu immunization.

All decisions of the special masters will be made available to the public unless they contain trade secrets or commercial or financial information that is privileged and confidential, or medical or similar information whose disclosure would clearly be an unwarranted invasion of privacy. When such a decision or designated substantive order is filed, the person submitting the information has 14 days to identify and to move to delete such information before the document’s disclosure. If the special master agrees that the identified material fits within the categories listed above, the special master shall redact such material from public access. 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-12(d)(4)(B); Vaccine Rule 18(b).

Nevertheless, the parties agree to the joint stipulation, attached hereto as Appendix A. The undersigned finds said stipulation reasonable and adopts it as the decision of the Court in awarding damages, on the terms set forth therein.

Damages awarded in that stipulation include:

**A lump sum payment of \$30,000.00, in the form of a check payable to petitioner.**

In the absence of a motion for review filed pursuant to RCFC, Appendix B, the clerk is directed to enter judgment in case 07-217V according to this decision and the attached stipulation.
