DECISION AWARDING ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS¹

On March 8, 2012, petitioners filed an unopposed motion for award of final attorneys' fees and reimbursement of costs in this case.² Petitioners are entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees and costs pursuant to \S 15(b) and (e)(1). Respondent has

² Petitioners originally filed an opposed motion for attorneys' fees and costs on March 5, 2012. Respondent's counsel had opposed the motion on the grounds that he believed the case to be untimely filed. Respondent's counsel later communicated to petitioners' counsel that he no longer opposed the motion. On March 8, 2012, petitioners' counsel filed a motion to strike the earlier opposed motion and attached an unopposed motion for attorneys' fees and costs.

reviewed the motion and does not object. Petitioners seek attorneys' fees and costs in the amount of \$2,652.00. In lieu of filing a Vaccine General Order #9 statement, petitioners' counsel represents that he will reimburse petitioners any costs that petitioners personally incurred that are compensable under § 15 (e)(1).

The request for attorneys' fees and costs is granted. Petitioners are awarded reasonable attorneys' fees and costs pursuant to \$ 15(b) and (e)(1), as I find that the petition was brought in good faith and upon a reasonable basis, and the amounts requested are reasonable and appropriate.

Pursuant to §15(e), I award a lump sum of \$2,652.00 to be paid in the form of a check payable jointly to the petitioners and petitioners' counsel, David P. Matthews.

In the absence of a timely-filed motion for review filed pursuant to Appendix B of the Rules of the U.S. Court of Federal Claims, the clerk of the court shall enter judgment in accordance herewith.³
