FINAL ORDER


On July 24, 2017, the District of Columbia Court of Appeals issued an Order indefinitely suspending David L. Rose from the practice of law on the basis of disability. *See In Re: David L. Rose*, No. 205-16 (D.C. 2017).

Mr. Rose has been a member of this Court's bar since January 29, 2003 and has no currently pending cases. On June 18, 2019, this Court issued an order directing Mr. Rose to show cause within thirty (30) days why this Court should not impose a suspension identical to that imposed by the District of Columbia Court of Appeals. To date, Mr. Rose has not responded to the Order to Show Cause.¹ Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED consistent with Rule 83.2(c)(2) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims that David L. Rose be indefinitely suspended on the basis of disability from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims, *nunc pro tunc*, from July 24, 2017, the date of his suspension in the District of Columbia. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
