## FINAL ORDER

On September 7, 2018, the Supreme Court of the State of Nevada issued an order immediately suspending Ms. Ross from the practice of law in Nevada for a period of three years, with all but the first six months stayed. *See In re Ross*, No. 74509 (Nev. Sup. Ct. Sept. 7, 2018).

Ms. Ross has been a member of this court's bar since November 7, 2014. Under Rule 83.2(c)(2) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims ("RCFC"), an attorney admitted to practice before this court may be disciplined on the grounds of an act or omission that results in the disbarment or suspension of the attorney by another court.

On October 30, 2018, the court issued an Order to Show Cause, directing Ms. Ross to show cause within thirty (30) days why the court should not impose discipline identical to that imposed by the Supreme Court of Nevada. To date, Ms. Ross has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Karen H. Ross shall be suspended from practice before the United States Court of Federal Claims for a period of six months effective, *nunc pro tunc*, September 7, 2018, the date of her suspension by the Supreme Court of Nevada. The filing of any petition for reinstatement shall be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
