
FINAL ORDER

On March 5, 2025, the Supreme Court of Maryland entered an order disbaring Gary Pisner from the practice of law in the State of Maryland. *Attorney Grievance Commission of Maryland v. Gary Pisner*, Case No. C-15-CV-23-004631, AG No. 23. Mr. Pisner did not notify this Court of his suspension as required by Rule 83.2(e)(1)(B) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims (“RCFC”).

Mr. Pisner has been a member of this Court’s bar since June 18, 1992, and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(2), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined for an act or omission that results in the attorney’s disbarment or suspension by another court. In addition, under RCFC 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of failure to comply with the terms of RCFC 83.2, including failure to notify the Court in accordance with RCFC 83.2(e).

On April 7, 2025, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Pisner to show cause within thirty (30) days why he should not be disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Pisner would be disbarred from practice before the Court. *Id.* To date, Mr. Pisner has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Gary Pisner shall be disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims effective, *nunc pro tunc*, March 5, 2025, the date of his disbarment by the Supreme Court of Maryland. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
