FINAL ORDER

On August 18, 2025, the Supreme Court of Maryland entered an order disbaring David Andrew Edelstein. *Att’y Grievance Comm’n of Maryland. v. David Andrew Edelstein*, AG No. 8, September Term, 2025 (Md. 2025). Mr. Edelstein did not report to this Court this action as required by Rule 83.2(e) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims (“RCFC”). The Court learned of Mr. Edelstein’s status on that same day.


Mr. Edelstein has been a member of this Court’s bar since June 1, 2010, and has no pending cases. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(2), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined for an act, omission, or impairment that results in the attorney’s disbarment or suspension by another court. In addition, under RCFC 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may be disciplined on the grounds of failure to comply with the terms of RCFC 83.2, including failure to notify the Court in accordance with RCFC 83.2(e).

On September 22, 2025, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Edelstein to show cause within 30 days why he should not be disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims. ECF No. 3. The Order to Show Cause further stated that if no response was received, Mr. Edelstein would be disbarred. *Id.* To date, Mr. Edelstein has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that David Andrew Edelstein is disbarred from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims effective, *nunc pro tunc*, August 18, 2025, the date this Court received notice of his disbarment in Maryland. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
