FINAL ORDER

On June 11, 2025, the Supreme Court of Alabama entered an order suspending Anthony Ifediba from the practice of law in Alabama for one hundred eighty (180) days effective June 25, 2025. *In the Matter of Anthony Chuma Ifediba, ASB-ATT-DIS-0132*. Mr. Ifediba did not notify this Court of his suspension as required by Rule 83.2(e)(1)(B) of the Rules of the United States Court of Federal Claims (“RCFC”).

Mr. Ifediba has been a member of this Court’s bar since August 4, 2022, and has one pending case: *Smith v. Sec’y, Dept. of Health & Human Servs.*, case no. 22-vv-857. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(2), an attorney admitted to practice before this Court may be disciplined for an act or omission that results in the attorney’s disbarment or suspension by another court. Under RCFC 83.2(c)(4), an attorney may also be disciplined for failing to notify the Court of discipline imposed by another court in accordance with RCFC 83.2(e).

On November 19, 2025, the Court issued an order directing Mr. Ifediba to show cause within thirty (30) days why he should not be suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims in accordance with the Court’s presumed discipline for suspension by another court. *See* RCFC 83.2(g)(7)(B). To date, Mr. Ifediba has not responded to the Order to Show Cause. Therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Anthony Ifediba shall be indefinitely suspended from the practice of law before the United States Court of Federal Claims effective, *nunc pro tunc*, June 11, 2025, the date of his suspension by the Supreme Court of Alabama. The filing of any petition for reinstatement will be governed by RCFC 83.2(k)(1).
