<u>Instructions for Admission by Verified Application</u>

The accompanying form must be used in applying for admission to the bar of this court pursuant to RCFC 83.1(a)(1). This form must be duly executed and submitted electronically, along with the items enumerated below, through PACER (Public Access to Court Electronic Records) at www.pacer.gov.

- 1. A certificate issued within the last 30 days by the clerk of the highest court of any U.S. state, territory, or possession, or the District of Columbia, attesting to your admission to the bar of that court and your good standing therein (Note: a letter from the bar of your state is NOT acceptable); and
- 2. A letter or signed statement from an attorney stating the following:
 - a. The attorney is a member of the bar of this court or of the Supreme Court of the United States;
 - b. The attorney is not related to you;
 - c. You are personally known to the attorney;
 - d. You possess all of the qualifications required for admission here;
 - e. The attorney has examined your application; and
 - f. The attorney affirms that your personal and professional character and standing are good.

Payment must be made electronically in the amount required by the fee schedule posted on the court's website at www.uscfc.uscourts.gov/fee-schedule. Upon successful completion of the admission process, the clerk will send the applicant an e-mail including a hyperlink requesting payment of the application fee using Pay.gov.

Applications must be complete when submitted.

Admission under this procedure does not require your appearance in person. A certificate will be forwarded to you upon payment of the application fee.
