**DECISION AWARDING ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS <sup>1</sup>**

On November 1, 2011, petitioner filed a motion for award of final attorneys' fees and reimbursement of costs in this case. On November 4, 2011, the undersigned stayed the petitioner's application for fees and costs for thirty days to allow the parties to informally discuss the application. On December 2, 2011, respondent's counsel orally communicated to an OSM staff attorney that respondent does not oppose petitioner's motion for fees and costs. Petitioner is entitled to reasonable attorneys' fees and costs pursuant to §§ 15(b) and (e)(1). Respondent has reviewed the motion and does not object. Petitioner seeks attorneys' fees and costs in the amount of \$2,710.48. In lieu of

filing a Vaccine General Order #9 statement, petitioner's counsel represents that she will reimburse petitioner any costs that petitioner personally incurred that are compensable under § 15 (e)(1).

**The request for attorneys' fees and costs is granted.** Petitioner is awarded reasonable attorneys' fees and costs pursuant to §§ 15(b) and (e)(1), as I find that the petition was brought in good faith and upon a reasonable basis, and the amounts requested are reasonable and appropriate.

**Pursuant to §15(e), I award a lump sum of \$2,710.48<sup>2</sup> to be paid in the form of a check payable jointly to the petitioner and petitioner's counsel, Sherry K. Drew.**

In the absence of a timely-filed motion for review filed pursuant to Appendix B of the Rules of the U.S. Court of Federal Claims, the clerk of the court shall enter judgment in accordance herewith.<sup>3</sup>

**IT IS SO ORDERED.**

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<sup>2</sup> This amount is intended to cover all legal expenses incurred in this matter. This award encompasses all charges by the attorney against a client, "advanced costs" as well as fees for legal services rendered. Furthermore, § 15(e)(3) prevents an attorney from charging or collecting fees (including costs) that would be in addition to the amount awarded herein. See generally Beck v. Sec'y of Dep't Health and Human Services, 924 F.2d 1029 (Fed. Cir.1991).
