UNPUBLISHED DECISION ON FEES AND COSTS¹

Petitioner Catherine Guidry, parent of Hayden Guidry, filed a final application for attorneys' fees and costs on December 17, 2010. The Court awards the amount to which respondent has not objected.

Petitioner claimed that the diphtheria-tetanus-acellular pertussis (DTaP), hemophilus influenza type b, rotavirus, and pneumococcal vaccines caused Hayden an adverse reaction and received compensation based upon the parties' stipulation. Decision, filed July 23, 2010. Because petitioner received compensation, she is entitled to an award of attorneys' fees and costs. 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-15(e).

All decisions of the special masters will be made available to the public unless they contain trade secrets or commercial or financial information that is privileged and confidential, or medical or similar information whose disclosure would clearly be an unwarranted invasion of privacy. When such a decision or designated substantive order is filed, the person submitting the information has 14 days to identify and to move to delete such information before the document's disclosure. If the special master agrees that the identified material fits within the categories listed above, the special master shall redact such material from public access. 42 U.S.C. § 300aa-12(d)(4)(B); Vaccine Rule 18(b).

Petitioner seeks a total of **\$23,087.20** in attorneys' fees and **\$1,612.69** in costs for petitioner's counsel. Additionally, petitioner filed a statement of costs in compliance with General Order No. 9, stating that she incurred **\$268.30** while pursuing this claim. Respondent stated that she had no objection to this application for attorneys' fees and costs.

After reviewing the request, the court awards **\$24,968.19** in attorneys' fees and other litigation costs. The court thanks the parties for their cooperative efforts in resolving this matter.

The Clerk shall enter judgment accordingly.²
